Getting Research Published: Writing Effectively and Well in Science

Excellent scientists need excellent data, but they also need to be able to effectively communicate the results and significance of their research to their peers in the community. In this workshop, you will learn about the structural and language norms for papers published in English. You will also be introduced to a variety of writing tools that will help you to effectively draft your own texts, pinpoint their strengths and weaknesses, and revise them effectively.

Core topics of the workshop are:

- | finding a focus by identifying an appropriate research question
- examining structural relationships within and between sections of a paper
- | managing your writing process professionally
- giving, receiving, and using feedback effectively
- | understanding the drafting and revision processes
- creating precise, accurate, and correct English sentences
- recognizing stylistically adequate and inadequate language
- | avoiding common language-related pitfalls.
